Career Education Industry Training

Grades 11 & 12

Students attain knowledge and skills while earning graduation credits that may lead to industry certification, apprenticeship and/or a portfolio. Many students move on to employment, further training or post-secondary education related to their program choice. Most programs offer both in-class education and work experience.

A one-year* program that leads to apprenticeship level one technical training certification

YOUTH WORK IN TRADES

(SSA)

Students are hired as apprentices in almost any trade while still in school

- 480 hours of paid work
- Potential eligibility for a \$1000 scholarship



INDUSTRY CONNECT

A one-year program in which students develop a professional portfolio

- Music Production & Technology
- Film & Broadcast
- Graphics/Media Arts
- Health Sciences
- Robotics (Mechatronics)

INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION

A one-year program that leads to industry certification

- Computer Networking Technician
- Fitness Instructor
- Hotel & Event Management
